















- Initial implementation of college and career pathways
- Increased staffing to support college and career readiness goals
- College and career readiness pipeline, Pre-K-12
- Career mentoring for pathways



### College and Career Readiness Framework

- Focus on instructional fundamentals to ensure that students have access to career pathways that lead to Real World Learning experiences, including:
  - Individual Career Academic Plans
  - Careers course for 8<sup>th</sup> graders
  - Client projects
  - Stackable credentials

## College and Career Readiness: / Middle School

#### **AVID**

- Implemented in 2018, serving 310 students
- 94% Minority
- 100% Low Socioeconomic Status
- 81% are 1<sup>st</sup> Generation College Students

#### Nepris (The Connector)

- Virtually connecting students to industry professionals
- 110 sessions offered in 2019-2020
- Implementation into 7th grade core classes, 2020-2021

#### College and Career Readiness Course

- Exploratory course required for all 8th grade students
- Aid in high school pathway selection







## College and Career Readiness: High School

#### College and Career Pathways

- Includes required 9th grade research class collaboratively taught by Math and English Language Arts teachers
- Prepares students for all careers + careers of the future
- Aligned pathways to Real World Learning outcomes + Market Value Assets

## College and Career Readiness: Middle College

- Targeted at adults who dropped out of high school
  - Must be 17-24 years old
  - High school diploma option for students under 21 years old
  - GED option for students over 21 years old
- Placed at MCC Penn Valley campus
  - Students receive rights and privileges of college students
- Assisted transition options upon completion
  - Continue education at community college
  - Support for transition into workforce to begin a career in partnership with Full Employment Council
  - Occupational career pathways include: health care, advanced manufacturing and business


