

EWING MARION KAUFFMAN FOUNDATION COVID-19 VACCINATION POLICY AND TRACKING FOR VISITORS, VENDORS, AND CONFERENCE CENTER ATTENDEES

The Ewing Marion Kauffman Foundation is implementing a COVID-19 vaccine requirement for all onsite staff, visitors, vendors, and conference center attendees. Our objective is to support a work and convening environment that is as healthy and safe as possible. We're taking this measure to support the health of those working and meeting at the Foundation as well as community health.

Effective March 14, 2022, anyone entering the building must be 'fully vaccinated' against COVID-19 and must provide accurate proof of vaccination. The Kauffman Foundation is aligning with how the CDC defines 'fully vaccinated' which currently means the following:

- a. Two doses of Pfizer-BioNTech or Moderna, or
- b. One dose of the Johnson & Johnson vaccine, and
- c. Two weeks or longer after receiving requisite dose(s)

The Kauffman Foundation is requiring everyone to provide proof of vaccination (paper or digital) along with a valid photo ID for verification prior to entry.

Acceptable proofs of vaccination include:

- a. COVID-19 vaccination card
- b. Medical records or immunization records from health care provider or pharmacy
- c. Immunization records from public health, state, or tribal immunization information systems
- d. Official documentation that contains the type of vaccine administered, date of administration, name, and company/organization that administered the vaccination

You will need to show proof of vaccination for each visit to the Kauffman Foundation or Conference Center. If there is a minor present who does not have a valid photo ID, an adult in attendance will need to be able to confirm their identity.

If you are not able to meet the requirements of the Kauffman Foundation's COVID-19 vaccination policy, please reach out to your meeting host about a virtual option (if applicable).
