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Reporting and Evaluation Expectations

Measuring impact, communicating research findings, and disseminating learnings are priorities for the Kauffman Foundation. We encourage applicants with skillsets in research translation and impact to emphasize this experience in their proposals. However, funded applicants will work with the Kauffman team (regardless of previous experience) to ensure research products are shared with relevant audiences. Grantees can expect to work with the Kauffman team throughout the duration of their grant in several ways:

- Potential participation in ongoing learning and convening as part of communities of practice
- Engagement with grantees across research and practice to facilitate translation, community resonance, and impact
